## THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

### The 1<sup>st</sup> Reading: *Exodus 14:21-31*

The first reading is written in the fourteenth  
chapter of Exodus, beginning at verse twenty  
one.

Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea,  
and all that night the Lord drove the sea back with  
a strong east wind and turned it into dry land. The  
waters were divided, and the Israelites went  
through the sea on dry ground, with a wall of  
water on their right and on their left.

The Egyptians pursued them, and all Pharaoh's  
horses and chariots and horsemen followed them  
into the sea. During the last watch of the night the  
Lord looked down from the pillar of fire and cloud  
at the Egyptian army and threw it into confusion.

He jammed the wheels of their chariots so that they had difficulty driving. And the Egyptians said, "Let's get away from the Israelites! The Lord is fighting for them against Egypt."

Then the Lord said to Moses, "Stretch out your hand over the sea so that the waters may flow back over the Egyptians and their chariots and horsemen." Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and at daybreak the sea went back to its place. The Egyptians were fleeing toward it, and the Lord swept them into the sea. The water flowed back and covered the chariots and horsemen—the entire army of Pharaoh that had followed the Israelites into the sea. Not one of them survived.

But the Israelites went through the sea on dry ground, with a wall of water on their right and on their left. That day the Lord saved Israel from the hands of the Egyptians, and Israel saw the Egyptians lying dead on the shore. And when the Israelites saw the mighty hand of the Lord displayed against the Egyptians, the people feared the Lord and put their trust in him and in Moses his servant. (NIV) The word of the Lord.

The second reading is written in the thirteenth chapter of Romans, beginning at verse one.

Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that

which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God.

Consequently, whoever rebels against the authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and those who do so will bring judgment on themselves.

For rulers hold no terror for those who do right, but for those who do wrong. Do you want to be free from fear of the one in authority? Then do what is right and you will be commended. For the one in authority is God's servant for your good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for rulers do not bear the sword for no reason. They are God's servants, agents of wrath to bring punishment on the wrongdoer.

Therefore, it is necessary to submit to the authorities, not only because of possible punishment but also as a matter of conscience. This is also why you pay taxes, for the authorities are God's servants, who give their full time to governing. Give to everyone what you owe them: If you owe taxes, pay taxes; if revenue, then revenue; if respect, then respect; if honor, then honor. (NIV) The word of the Lord.


