

THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

The 1st Reading: *Ezekiel 37:1-10*

The first reading from the thirty-seventh chapter of the book of Ezekiel, beginning at the first verse.

¹ The hand of the Lord was on me, and he brought me out by the Spirit of the Lord and set me in the middle of a valley; it was full of bones. ² He led me back and forth among them, and I saw a great many bones on the floor of the valley, bones that were very dry. ³ He asked me, "Son of man, can these bones live?" I said, "Sovereign Lord, you alone know."

⁴ Then he said to me, "Prophecy to these bones and say to them, 'Dry bones, hear the word of the Lord!' ⁵ This is what the Sovereign Lord says to these bones: I will make breath enter you, and you will come to life. ⁶ I will attach tendons to you and make flesh come upon you and cover you with skin; I will put breath in you, and you will come to life. Then you will know that I am the Lord."

⁷ So I prophesied as I was commanded. And as I was prophesying, there was a noise, a rattling sound, and the bones came together, bone to bone. ⁸ I looked, and tendons and flesh appeared on them and skin covered them, but there was no breath in them.

⁹ Then he said to me, "Prophecy to the breath; prophecy, son of man, and say to it, 'This is what the Sovereign Lord says: Come, breath, from the four winds and breathe into these slain, that they may live.'" ¹⁰ So I prophesied as he commanded me, and breath entered them; they came to life and stood up on their feet—a vast army. (NIV) The word of the Lord.

⁴ for everyone born of God overcomes the world. This is the victory that has overcome the world, even our faith. ⁵Who is it that overcomes the world? Only the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God. ⁶This is the one who came by water and blood—Jesus Christ. He did not come by water only, but by water and blood. And it is the Spirit who testifies, because the Spirit is the truth. ⁷For there are three that testify: ⁸the Spirit, the water and the blood; and the three are in agreement.

⁹We accept human testimony, but God's testimony is greater because it is the testimony of God, which he has given about his Son. ¹⁰Whoever believes in the Son of God accepts this testimony. Whoever does not believe God has made him out to be a liar, because they have not believed the testimony God has given about his Son. ¹¹And this is the testimony: God has given us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. ¹²Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life. (NIV) The word of the Lord.

In the same way after supper, he took the Cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying: Drink this, all of you for this is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins: Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

And so, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, we your humble servants, with all your holy church, remembering the precious death of your beloved Son, his mighty resurrection, his glorious ascension, and looking for his coming again in glory, make before you, in this Sacrament of the holy Bread of eternal life and the Cup of everlasting salvation, the memorial which he has commanded; and we wholly desire your fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, as we humbly ask you, by the merits and death of your Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his Blood, to grant to us and all your church the remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.

And we pray that, by the presence and power of your Holy Spirit, all we who are partakers of this holy communion may be filled with

your grace and heavenly benediction; through Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom, by whom and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory be given to you, Father Almighty, forever and ever. **Amen.**
