

Lead The voice of the Lord twists the oaks and strips the forests bare. And in his temple all cry, "Glory!"

All The Lord sits enthroned over the flood; the Lord is enthroned as King forever.

Lead The Lord gives strength to his people; the Lord blesses his people with peace.

The 1st Reading: 1Kings 18:17-39

The first reading is from the eighteenth chapter of the book of First Kings, beginning at the thirtieth verse.

When he saw Elijah, he said to him, “Is that you, you troubler of Israel?”

¹⁸ “I have not made trouble for Israel,” Elijah replied. “But you and your father’s family have. You have abandoned the Lord’s commands and have followed the Baals. ¹⁹ Now summon the people from all over Israel to meet me on Mount Carmel. And bring the four hundred and fifty prophets of Baal and the four hundred prophets of Asherah, who eat at Jezebel’s table.”

²⁰ So Ahab sent word throughout all Israel and assembled the prophets on Mount Carmel.

²¹ Elijah went before the people and said, “How long will you waver between two opinions? If the Lord is God, follow him; but if Baal is God, follow him.” But the people said nothing.

²² Then Elijah said to them, “I am the only one of the Lord’s prophets left, but Baal has four hundred and fifty prophets. ²³ Get two bulls for us. Let Baal’s prophets choose one for themselves, and let them cut it into pieces and put it on the wood but not set fire to it. I will prepare the other bull and put it on the wood but not set fire to it.

²⁴ Then you call on the name of your god, and I will call on the name of the Lord. The god who answers by fire—he is God.”

Then all the people said, “What you say is good.”

²⁵ Elijah said to the prophets of Baal, “Choose one of the bulls and prepare it first, since there are so many of you. Call on the name of your god, but do not light the fire.” ²⁶ So they took the bull given them and prepared it.

Then they called on the name of Baal from morning till noon. “Baal, answer us!” they shouted. But there was no response; no one answered. And they danced around the altar they had made.

²⁷ At noon Elijah began to taunt them. “Shout louder!” he said. “Surely he is a god! Perhaps he is deep in thought, or busy, or traveling. Maybe he is sleeping and must be awakened.” ²⁸ So they shouted louder and slashed themselves with swords and spears, as was their custom, until their blood flowed. ²⁹ Midday passed, and they continued their frantic prophesying until the time for the evening sacrifice. But there was no response, no one answered, no one paid attention.

³⁰ Then Elijah said to all the people, “Come here to me.” They came to him, and he repaired the altar of the Lord, which had been torn down.

³¹ Elijah took twelve stones, one for each of the tribes descended from Jacob, to whom the word of the Lord had come, saying, “Your name shall be Israel.” ³² With the stones he built an altar in the name of the Lord, and he dug a trench around it large enough to hold two seahs of seed. ³³ He arranged the wood, cut the bull into pieces and laid it on the wood. Then he said to them, “Fill four large jars with water and pour it on the offering and on the wood.”

³⁴ “Do it again,” he said, and they did it again. “Do it a third time,” he ordered, and they did it the third time. ³⁵ The water ran down around the altar and even filled the trench.

³⁶ At the time of sacrifice, the prophet Elijah stepped forward and prayed: “Lord, the God of

Abraham, Isaac and Israel, let it be known today that you are God in Israel and that I am your servant and have done all these things at your command. ³⁷ Answer me, Lord, answer me, so these people will know that you, Lord, are God, and that you are turning their hearts back again.” ³⁸ Then the fire of the Lord fell and burned up the sacrifice, the wood, the stones and the soil, and also licked up the water in the trench. ³⁹ When all the people saw this, they fell prostrate and cried, “The Lord—he is God! The Lord—he is God!”

Te Deum

We praise you, O God; we acknowledge you to be the Lord. All creation worships you; the everlasting Father. To you all the angels and the powers of heaven loudly cry, To you cherubim and seraphim continually sing, Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of hosts; Heaven and earth are full of the majesty of your glory.

The glorious company of the apostles praise you: The noble fellowship of the prophets praise you. The white-robed army of martyrs praise you. O Lord, by your grace, keep us this day from all sin. O Lord, have mercy on us, have mercy on us. O Lord, let your mercy rest upon us, for we put our trust in you. O Lord, I have trusted in you; let me not be abandoned at the last.

The 2nd Reading: Acts 19:21-end

The second reading is from the nineteenth chapter of the book of Acts, beginning at the twenty-first verse.

After all this had happened, Paul decided to go to Jerusalem, passing through Macedonia and Achaia. “After I have been there,” he said, “I must visit Rome also.” ²² He sent two of his helpers, Timothy and Erastus, to Macedonia, while he stayed in the province of Asia a little longer.

²³ About that time there arose a great disturbance about the Way. ²⁴ A silversmith named Demetrius, who made silver shrines of Artemis, brought in a lot of business for the craftsmen there. ²⁵ He called them together, along with the workers in related trades, and said: “You know, my friends, that we receive a good income from this business. ²⁶ And you see and hear how this fellow Paul has convinced and led astray large numbers of people here in Ephesus and in practically the whole province of Asia. He says that gods made by human hands are no gods at all. ²⁷ There is danger not only that our trade will lose its good name, but also that the temple of the great goddess Artemis will be discredited; and the goddess herself, who is worshiped throughout the province of Asia and the world, will be robbed of her divine majesty.”

²⁸ When they heard this, they were furious and began shouting: "Great is Artemis of the Ephesians!" ²⁹ Soon the whole city was in an uproar. The people seized Gaius and Aristarchus, Paul's traveling companions from Macedonia, and all of them rushed into the theater together.

³⁰ Paul wanted to appear before the crowd, but the disciples would not let him. ³¹ Even some of the officials of the province, friends of Paul, sent him a message begging him not to venture into the theater.

³² The assembly was in confusion: Some were shouting one thing, some another. Most of the people did not even know why they were there.

³³ The Jews in the crowd pushed Alexander to the front, and they shouted instructions to him. He motioned for silence in order to make a defense before the people. ³⁴ But when they realized he was a Jew, they all shouted in unison for about two hours: "Great is Artemis of the Ephesians!"

³⁵ The city clerk quieted the crowd and said: "Fellow Ephesians, doesn't all the world know that the city of Ephesus is the guardian of the temple of the great Artemis and of her image, which fell from heaven? ³⁶ Therefore, since these facts are undeniable, you ought to calm down and not do anything rash. ³⁷ You have brought these men here, though they have neither robbed temples nor blasphemed our goddess. ³⁸ If, then, Demetrius and his fellow craftsmen have a grievance against anybody, the courts are open and there are proconsuls. They can press charges. ³⁹ If there is anything further you want to bring up, it must be settled in a legal assembly. ⁴⁰ As it is, we are in danger of being charged with rioting because of what happened today. In that case we would not be able to account for this commotion, since there is no reason for it."

⁴¹ After he had said this, he dismissed the assembly.

As of June 8, we have entered Phase 3 of Re-Open Saskatchewan, with new provincial [Guidelines for Accommodating Worship](#), as well as updated [new directives](#) from our Bishops.

St. David's has resumed worship on June 14, with one service only, beginning at 9:30 a.m. (summer hours), and limited to 30 congregants only. We cannot go over this number. Our bishops have set the following directives (summarized; to read the letter, [click here](#)), and which may be updated as re-opening continues. Any updates will be posted to our "News" feed, and may effect changes. For a complete list of Directives, read the [letter](#) from the diocese available on our website.

Things of note:

As we resume services things are going to be quite a bit different. We hope in time we will see further easing of restrictions and increased numbers. ***As directives and guidelines change, we will change with them.***

First, there will only be one service, on Sundays at 9:30 a.m. (June-August), and limited to at this time to 30 congregants. ***Those who are ill with a communicable disease and those who are particularly vulnerable must stay home.***

Second, when you enter the Narthex, someone will greet you, and make a booklet available for you. If you take it home, we encourage you to not share it with other family members. The booklet is available on our website, [stdavidspa.org](#).

Third, no offering will be taken up during the service. If you have an offering, please place it in the plate available outside of the sanctuary. As well, you can still use our [electronic offering options](#), which we encourage.

Fourth, we ask you to enter the sanctuary **maintaining 6 feet / 2 meters distance** between you or your household, and others. Pews marked, each “mark” represents “a household”, an usurer will direct you. **Please beginning seating in the front pews first.**


Fifth, there will be no congregational singing at this time.

Sixth, during the administration of communion, **please remain in your seat.** The priest will bring the bread to you, and must wear a mask during distribution.

Finally, when the service is over, we ask that congregants depart **back pews first** to exit the church, and retaining the 6 feet / 2 meters of social distance with others. **The minister cannot greet you at the door, and we are not allowed to linger for fellowship in our building.**


Diagram:
